



CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY PROGRESS ON GI 2025 INITIATIVE

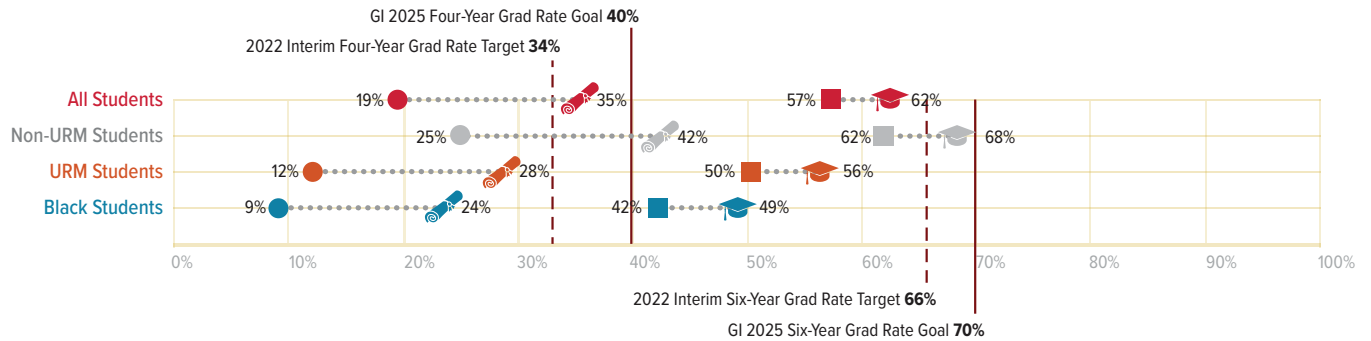
At the CSU, the four-year graduation rate for all first-time students has nearly doubled, increasing from 19% to 35%, while the six-year graduation rate has increased modestly from 57% to 62% since 2015. However, there are significant gaps between non-URM students and URM students- whose graduation rates are 14 points lower after four years and 12 points lower at the six-year mark. Those gaps are even more prevalent when comparing Black students to non-URM students at 18 points after four years and 19 points after six.

For transfer students, the two-year graduation rate has increased from 31% to 40% and the four-year graduation rate from 73% to 80%. URM students have two and four-year graduation rates that are two points lower than non-URM students. The gaps are larger for Black students, as they have two-year graduation rates that are six points lower, and four-year graduation rates that are eight points lower than non-URM students.

CSU is currently on track to reach one of the GI 2025 goals (for first-time four-year graduation rate) and is within two percentage points or less of meeting the interim target for two additional goals on transfer completion rates.

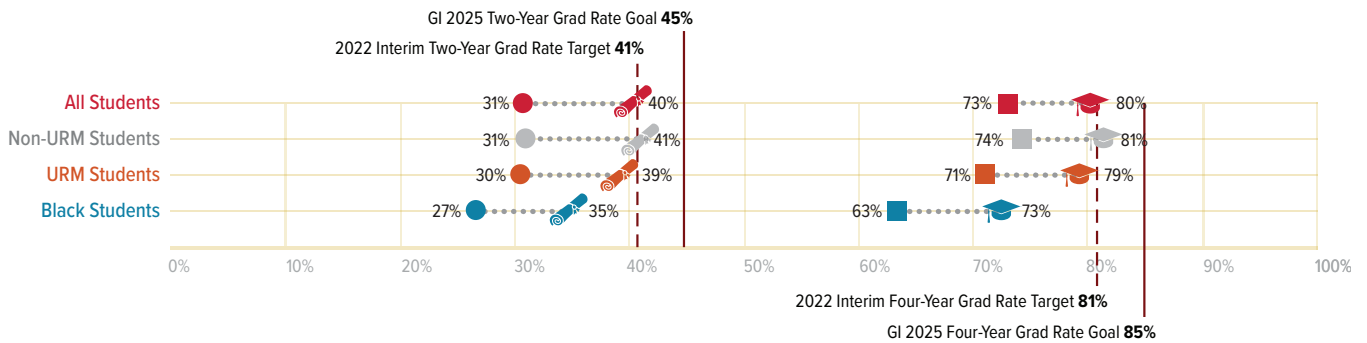
Four- and Six-Year Graduation Rates for First-Time Students
