



CSU DOMINGUEZ HILLS PROGRESS ON GI 2025 INITIATIVE

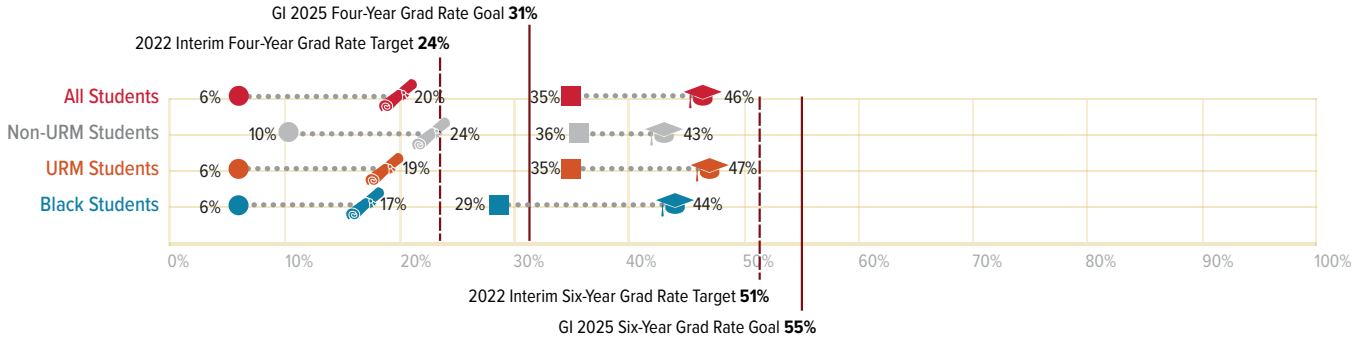
At CSU Dominguez Hills, the four-year graduation rate for all first-time students has more than tripled, increasing from 6% to 20%, and the six-year graduation rate has increased from 35% to 46% since 2015. There is a gap between non-URM students and URM students after four years of five points, but that gap is completely reversed at the six-year mark where URM students graduate at a rate four points higher than non-URM students. The same pattern holds true when comparing Black students to non-URM students, as they graduate at a rate seven points lower after four years, but one point higher after six.

For transfer students, the two-year graduation rate has increased from 28% to 36% and the four-year graduation rate from 65% to 73%. URM students have a graduation rate four points higher than non-URM students after two years, but two points lower after four, while Black students have an equal graduation rate to non-URM students after two years, but one 10 points lower after four.

Dominguez Hills has set all four of their campuswide goals for GI 2025 at rates significantly below the systemwide goal. **The campus is currently on track to reach two of its own GI 2025 goals, and none of the systemwide goals.** They were on pace to meet their own goal for six-year freshmen graduation before dropping seven points between 2021 and 2022, likely impacted by the pandemic.

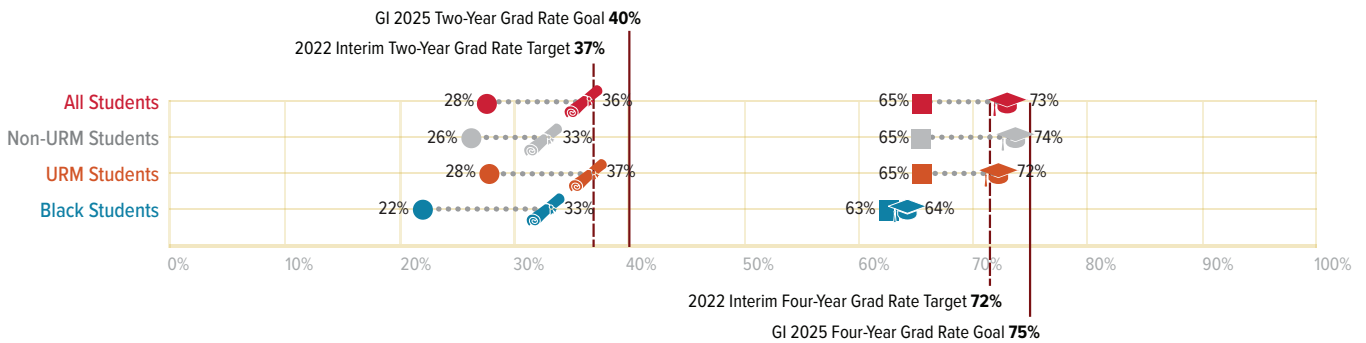
Four- and Six-Year Graduation Rates for First-Time Students
