



CAL POLY HUMBOLDT PROGRESS ON GI 2025 INITIATIVE

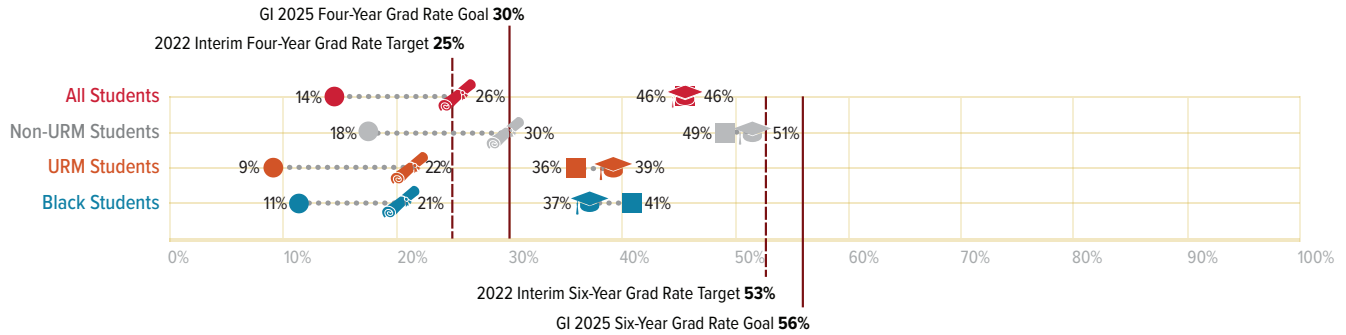
At Cal Poly Humboldt, the four-year graduation rate for all first-time students has almost doubled, increasing from 14% to 26%, but the six-year graduation rate has remained at 46% since 2015 despite increasing to 52% during the intervening years and then dropping back down. Gaps persist between non-URM students and URM students, whose graduation rates are eight points lower after four years and 12 points lower after six. The gaps are slightly larger when comparing Black students to non-URM students at nine points after four years and 14 points after six.

For transfer students, the two-year graduation rate has increased from 26% to 35% and the four-year graduation rate from 69% to 80%. URM students have slightly lower rates than non-URM students with a two-point gap after two years and a three-point gap after four. The gap between non-URM and Black transfer students is significant, at 14 points after two years and 24 points after four.

Humboldt has set all four campuswide goals for GI 2025 at rates significantly below the systemwide goals. **The campus is currently on track to reach two of their own GI 2025 goals, but none of the systemwide goals.** They did, however, fall short of the interim target for one goal, that of four-year transfer students, by under one percentage point.

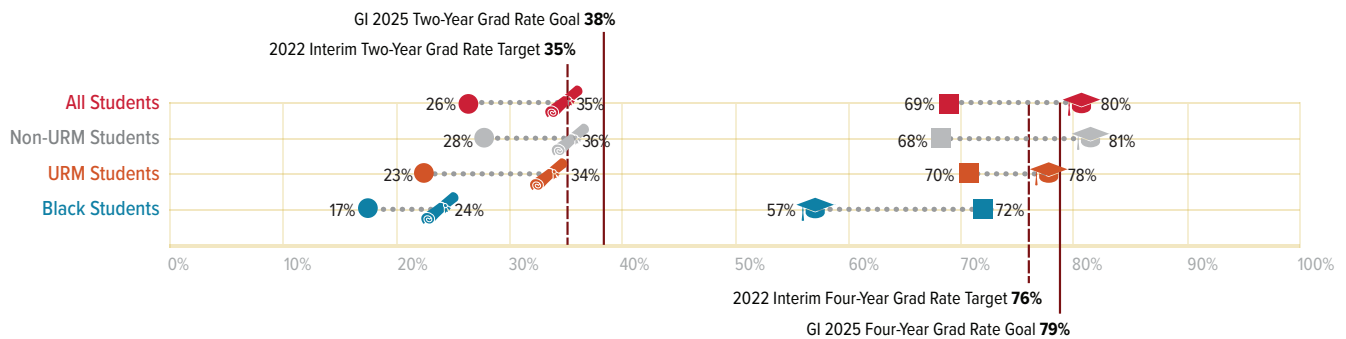
Four- and Six-Year Graduation Rates for First-Time Students
