



CSU NORTHRIDGE PROGRESS ON GI 2025 INITIATIVE

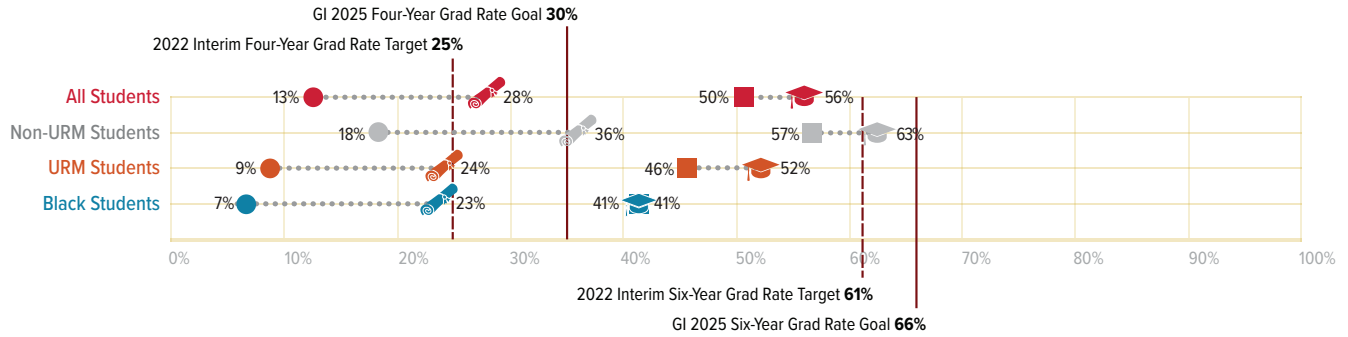
At CSU Northridge the four-year graduation rate for all first-time students has more than doubled, increasing from 13% to 28%, and the six-year graduation rate has increased from 50% to 56% since 2015. Gaps persist between non-URM students and URM students- whose graduation rates are 12 points lower after four years and 10 points lower after six. The gaps are even starker when comparing Black students to non-URM students at 13 points lower after four years and 21 points lower after six.

For transfer students, the two-year graduation rate has increased from 31% to 42% and the four-year graduation rate from 71% to 81%. There is a slight gap between URM and non-URM students with URM students having a two-year rate three points lower than non-URM students and a four-year gap just one point lower. Black transfer students have the same four-year rate as URM students but a two-year rate that is five percent lower than URM students and eight percent lower than non-URM students.

Northridge has set all its campuswide goals for GI 2025 at rates below the systemwide goals, although three of the four are within five points. **The campus is currently on track to reach three of its own GI 2025 goals and two of the systemwide goals.**

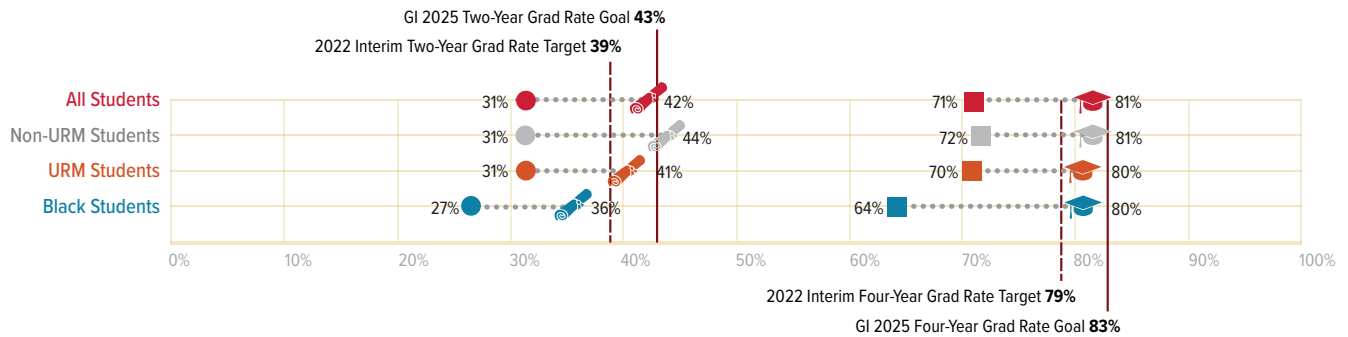
Four- and Six-Year Graduation Rates for First-Time Students
