



CAL POLY POMONA PROGRESS ON GI 2025 INITIATIVE

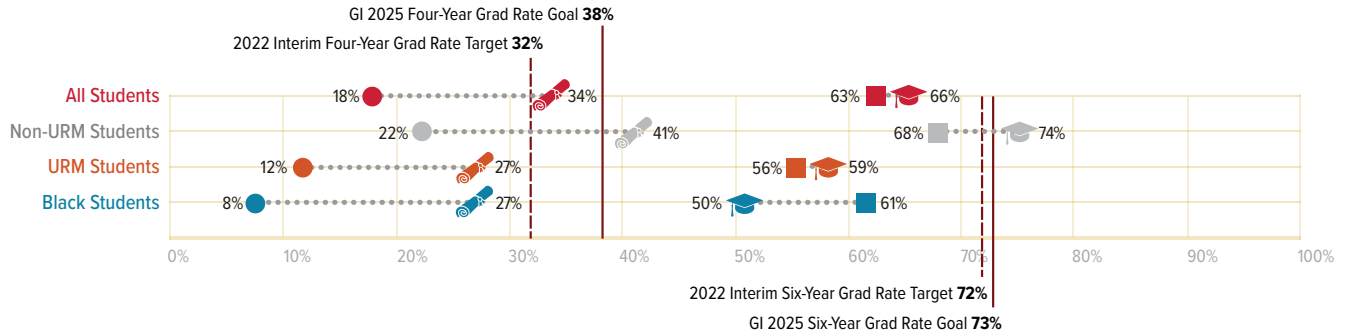
At Cal Poly Pomona, the four-year graduation rate for all first-time students has almost doubled, increasing from 18% to 34%, while the six-year graduation rate has increased modestly from 63% to 66% since 2015, but rose as high as 71% before dropping again in the intervening years. Gaps persist between non-URM students and URM students- whose graduation rates are 14 points lower after four years and 15 points lower after six. The gaps are even starker when comparing Black students to non-URM students at 15 points lower after four years and 24 points lower after six.

For transfer students, the two-year graduation rate has increased from 17% to 29% and the four-year graduation rate from 75% to 80%. There is a small gap between URM and non-URM students with URM students having a two-year rate two points lower than non-URM students and a four-year gap three points lower. Black transfer students have larger gaps with rates compared to non-URM students that are eight points lower after two-years and nine points lower after four.

Pomona has set two of its campuswide goals for GI 2025 at rates below the systemwide goals. **The campus is currently on track to reach two of its own GI 2025 goals and one of the systemwide goals.**

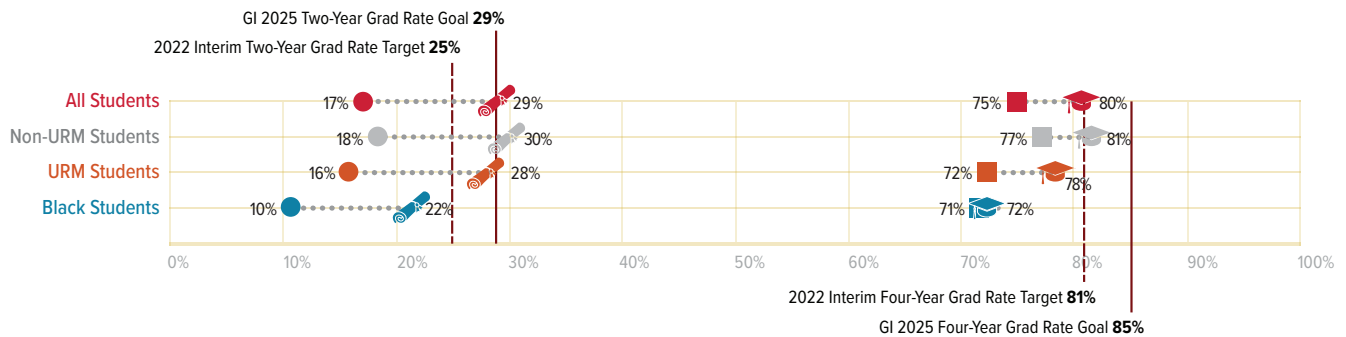
Four- and Six-Year Graduation Rates for First-Time Students
