



## CAL POLY SAN LUIS OBISPO PROGRESS ON GI 2025 INITIATIVE

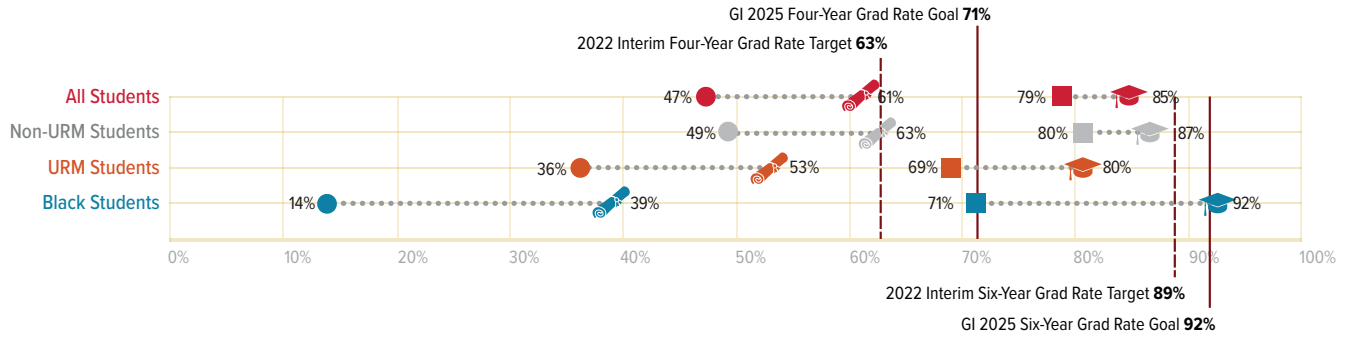
**At Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, which boasts the highest graduation rates in the system, the four-year graduation rate for all first-time students has increased from 47% to 61% and the six-year graduation rate has increased from 79% to 85% since 2015.** Gaps persist between non-URM students and URM students- whose graduation rates are 10 points lower after four years and six points lower after six years. Conversely, Black students had higher rates at both intervals than non-URM students in 2022, although these numbers were substantially different from previous years where graduation rates for Black students were markedly lower.

**For transfer students, the two-year graduation rate has increased from 34% to 37% and the four-year graduation rate stayed flat at 87%, despite rising as high as 90% in the intervening years.** There is a gap between URM and non-URM students with URM students having a two-year rate five points lower than non-URM students and a four-year gap six points lower. There was an insufficient total of Black transfer students to draw conclusions as to how comparable their rates are.

San Luis Obispo has set all of its campuswide goals for GI 2025 at rates above the systemwide goal as their graduation rates before the initiative began were significantly higher than most other campuses. **The campus is currently not on track to reach any of its own GI 2025 goals but is on track to hit three of the systemwide goals, two of which they already exceeded at the start of GI 2025.**

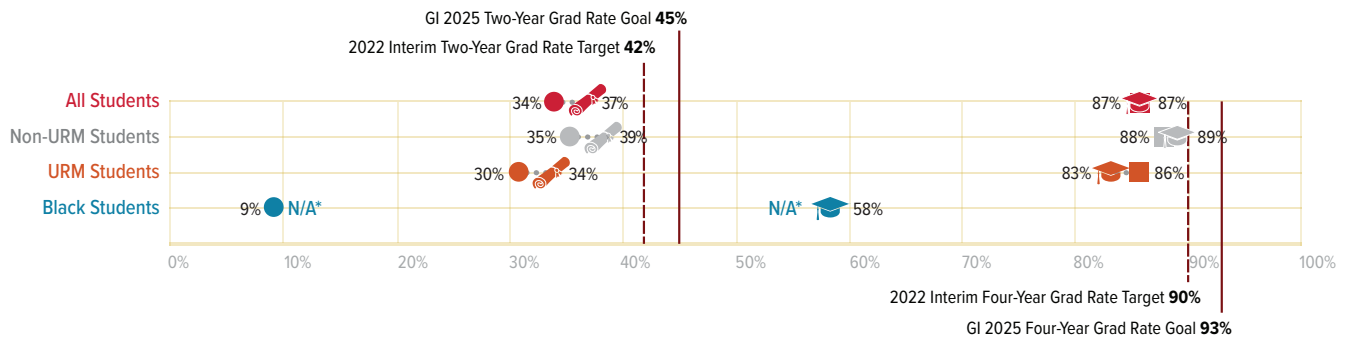
## Four- and Six-Year Graduation Rates for First-Time Students
