



STANISLAUS STATE PROGRESS ON GI 2025 INITIATIVE

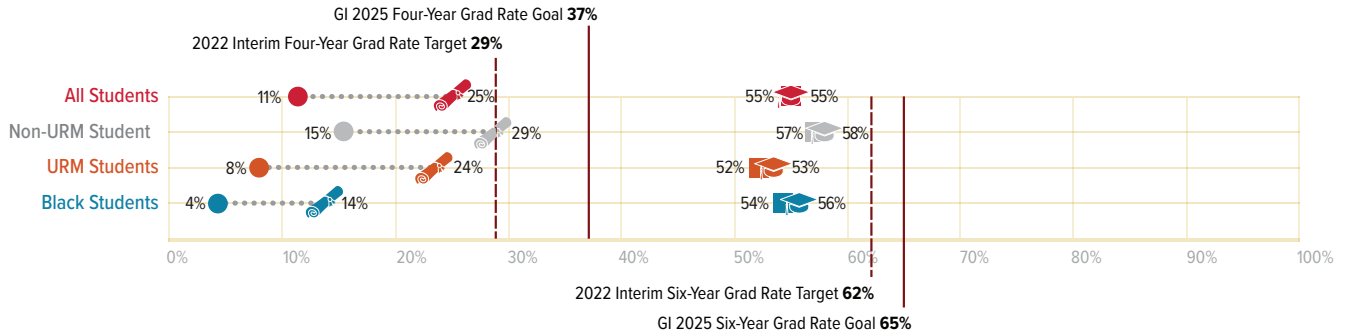
At Stanislaus State, the four-year graduation rate for all first-time students more than doubled, increasing from 11% to 25%, and the six-year graduation rate has stayed flat at 55% since 2015, despite reaching as high as 59% in the intervening years. Gaps persist between non-URM students and URM students- whose graduation rates are five points lower after both four and six years. The four-year gap is starker when comparing Black students to non-URM students at 15 points lower after four years although it drops to just two points after six years.

For transfer students, the two-year graduation rate has increased from 33% to 44% and the four-year graduation rate increased significantly from 68% to 80%. There is no gap between URM and non-URM students on either time interval, but there is substantial gap between Black transfer students and non-URM students of four points after two years and 10 points after four years.

Stanislaus has set three of its campuswide goals for GI 2025 at rates below the systemwide goals. **The campus is currently on track to reach two of its own transfer GI 2025 goals, but not the first-year student goals. The campus is on track to hit two of the systemwide goals.**

STANISLAUS STATE GRADUATION RATES

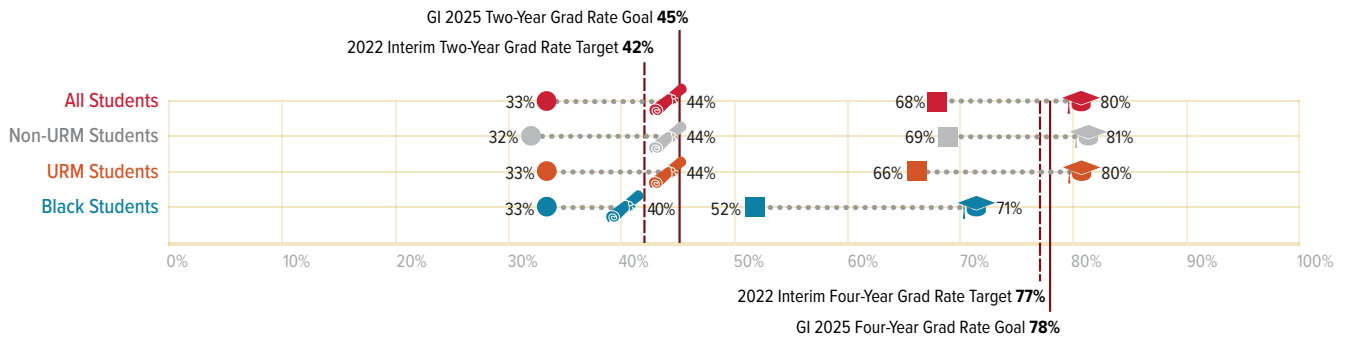
Four- and Six-Year Graduation Rates for First-Time Students
